

Beltrami Co. is the 21st largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased over the past decade, ranking as the 25th fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Beltrami Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).




Beltrami Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Beltrami Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

POPULATION PROJECTIONS


According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Beltrami Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Beltrami Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. 




LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 3.3%, Beltrami Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Beltrami Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 4.5% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Beltrami Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Beltrami Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Beltrami Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).




Job vacancies in Northwest reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Beltrami Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Beltrami Co. had the 78th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Beltrami Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$14.8 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$16.9 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).


Figure 12. Year Structure Built, 2022



OCCUPATIONS

At \$21.9 in 2023, wages were lower in Region 2 than the state. Overall, Region 2 had the 8th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$39.71) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$13.94) (see Table 11).




ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Beltrami Co. had the 20th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state.
