Cottonwood Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 8, which is located in the Southwest Planning Region.

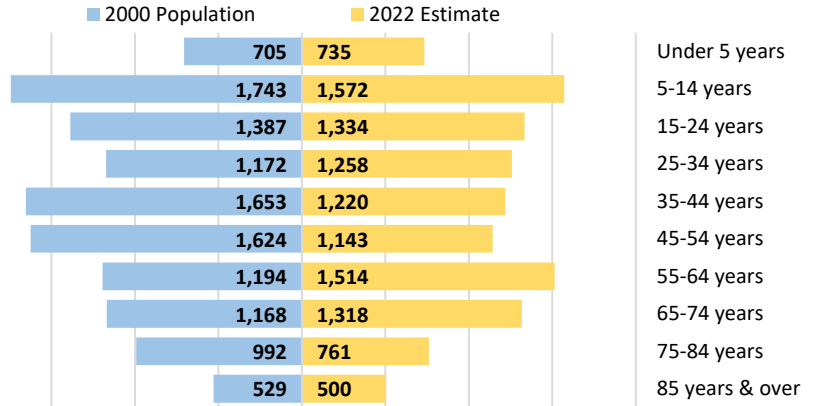

Cottonwood Co. is the 63rd largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased over the past decade, ranking as the 69th fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Cottonwood Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Cottonwood Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Cottonwood Co. welcomed net international immigration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

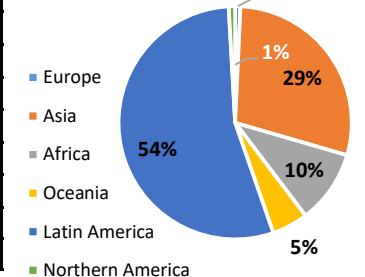

Figure 3. Population by Race, 2022

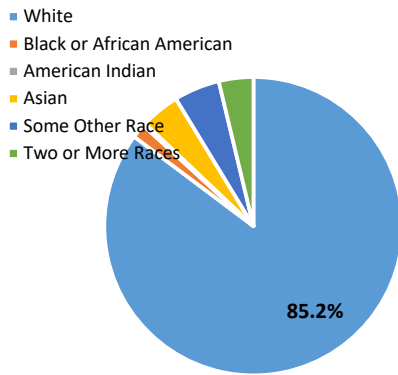

POPULATION PROJECTIONS

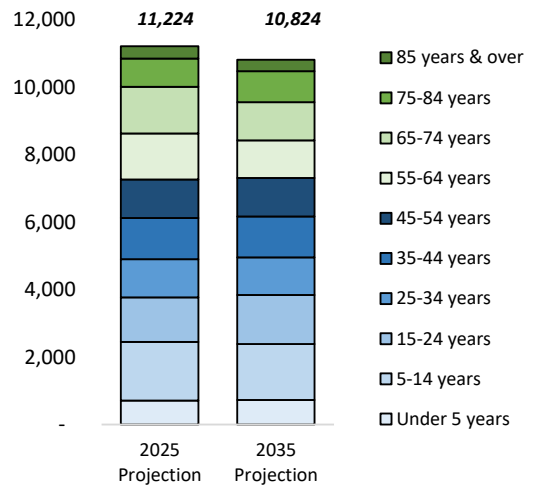
According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Cottonwood Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to decrease over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

Figure 4. Projections by Age Group, 2025-2035

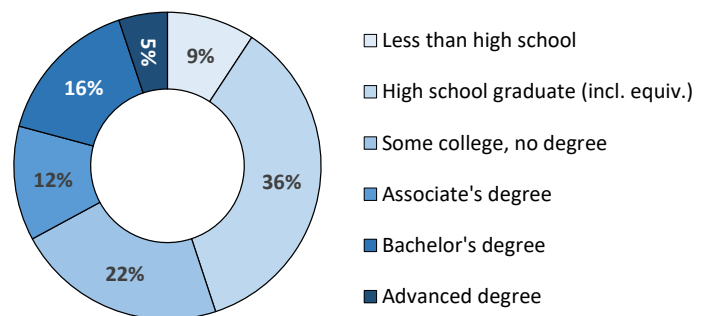


EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Cottonwood Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Cottonwood Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2022



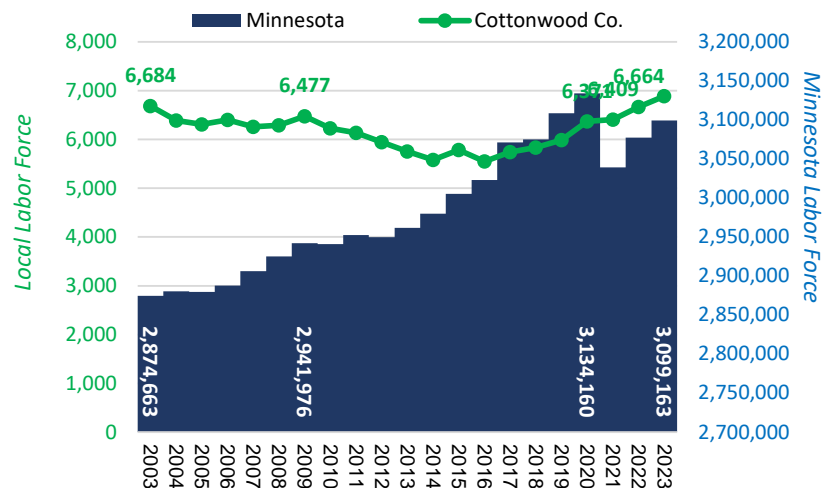

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.8%, Cottonwood Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Cottonwood Co.'s unemployment rate increased compared to the 3.9% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Cottonwood Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

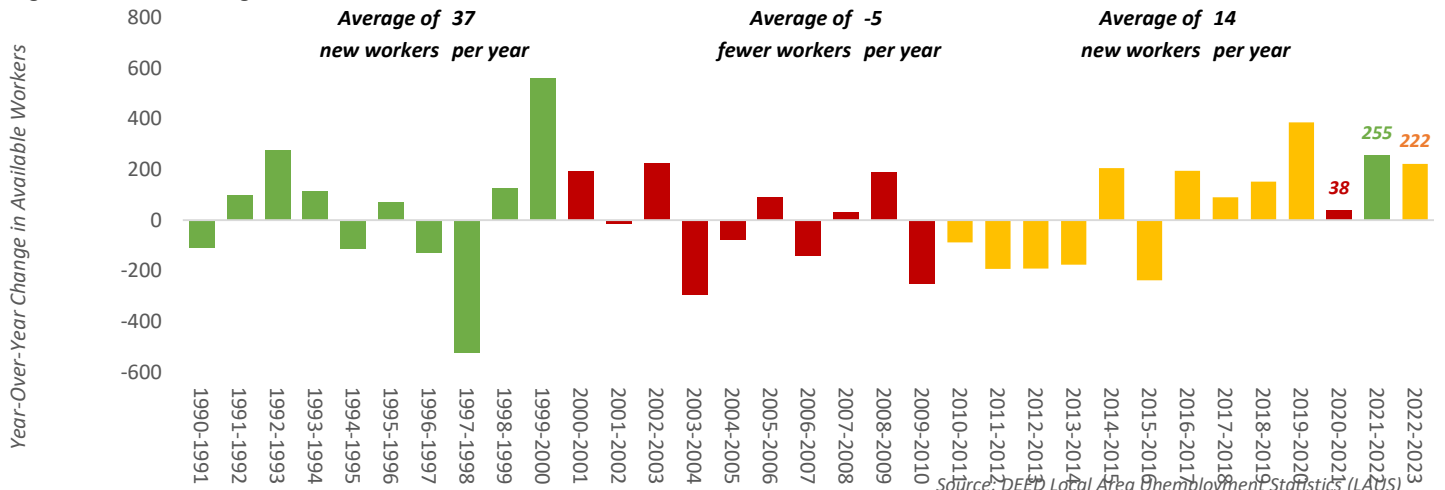
Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Cottonwood Co. averaged an annual loss of fewer workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Cottonwood Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).

Figure 7. Annual Change in Labor Force, 1990-2023



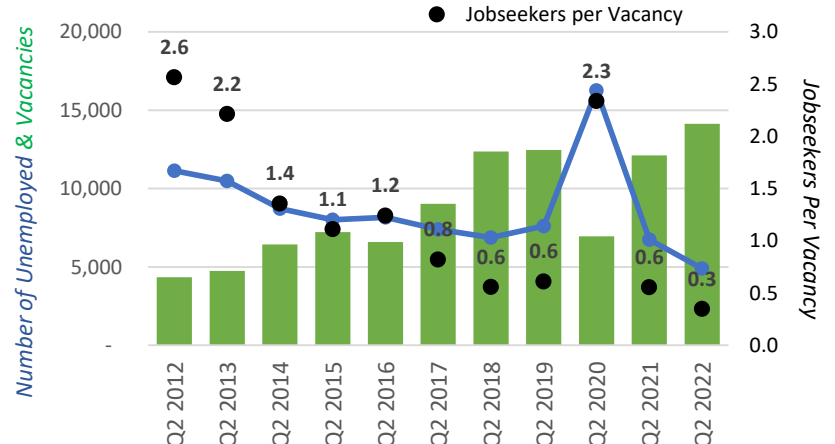

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. Job vacancies in Southwest reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).

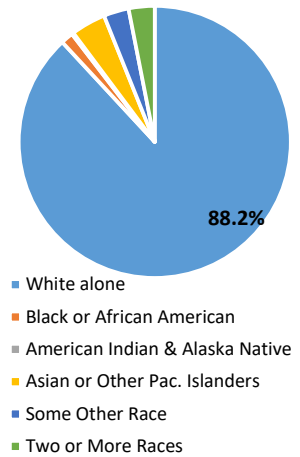
LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Cottonwood Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Cottonwood Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

Figure 9. Labor Force by Race, 2022



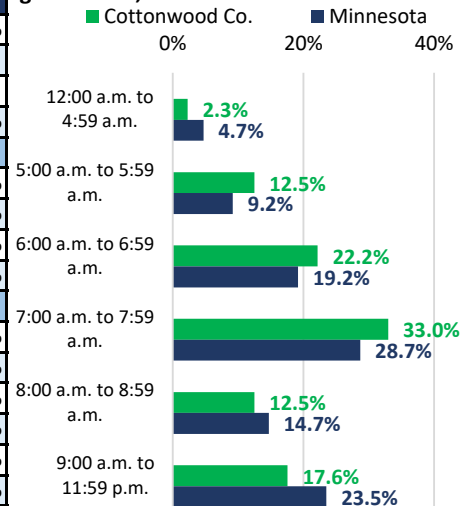

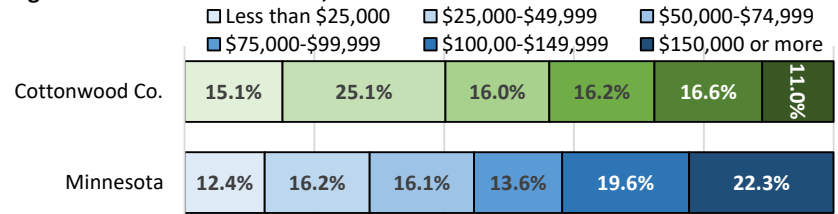
INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Cottonwood Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.29 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$14.53 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

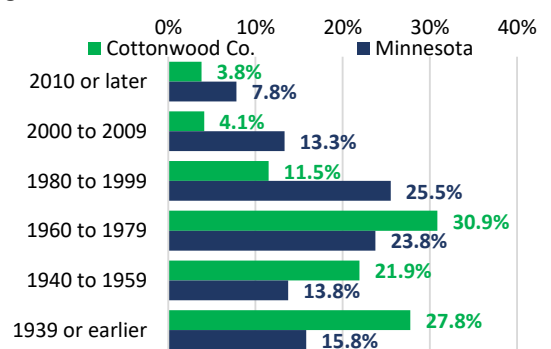

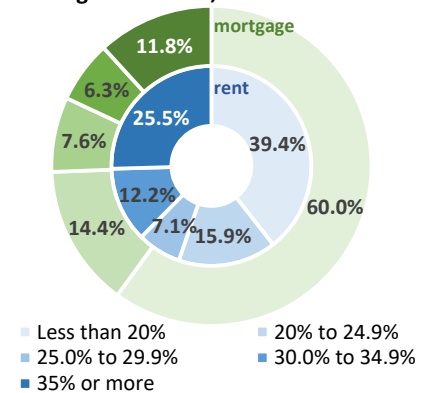

OCCUPATIONS

At \$21.23 in 2023, wages were lower in Region 8 than the state. Overall, Region 8 had the 4th lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$42.66) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.11) (see Table 11).

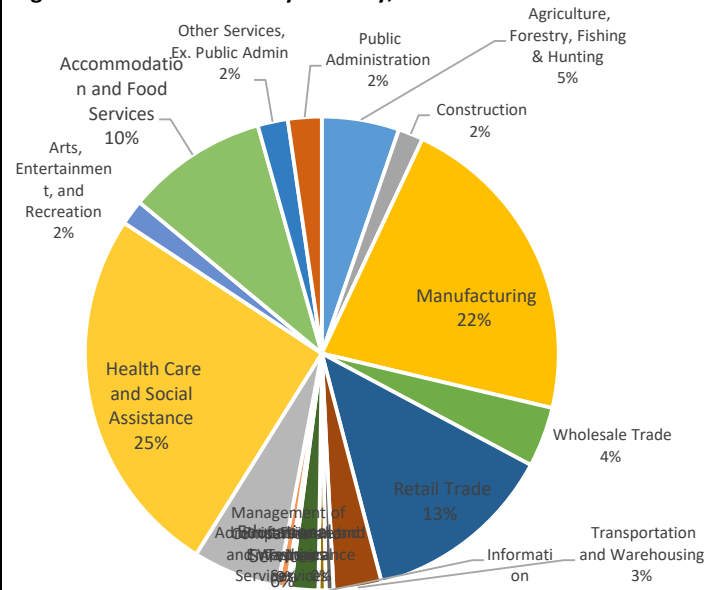
JOB VACANCY SURVEY

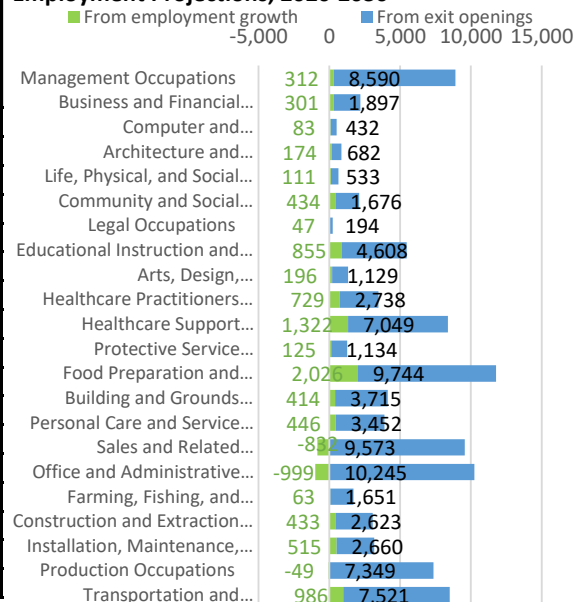

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Cottonwood Co. had the 52nd largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Cottonwood Co. was the 13th fastest growing in the past year and the 1st fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2022, employment in Cottonwood Co. grew despite the pandemic recession.

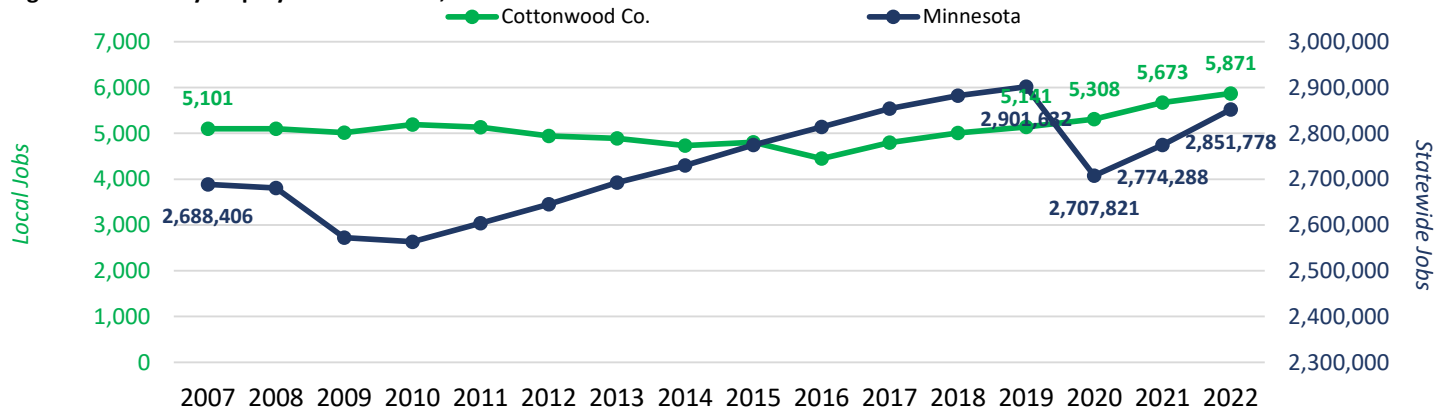

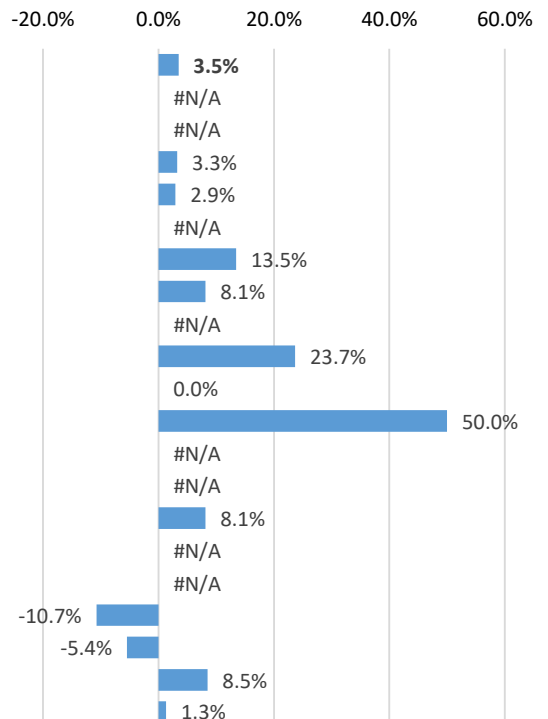
Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2007-2022
