
Isanti Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 7E, which is located in the Central Planning Region.

Isanti Co. is the 25th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased over the past decade, ranking as the 7th fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Isanti Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).



Isanti Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Isanti Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).



Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population, 2022





POPULATION PROJECTIONS



EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT



Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Isanti Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). 


Job vacancies in Central reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).



LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Isanti Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Isanti Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Isanti Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a lower percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Isanti Co. had the 13th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Isanti Co. had a higher cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$19.17 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$20.64 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).





Figure 13. Housing Costs as a Percentage of Income, 2022






ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS
