# **POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS**




Itasca Co. is the 22nd largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased over the past decade, ranking as the 45th fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Itasca Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure

Itasca Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Itasca Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).



#### **POPULATION PROJECTIONS**


According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Itasca Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

## **EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT**


Itasca Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. 

#### LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 4.5%, Itasca Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Itasca Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 6.3% prepandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Itasca Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.


Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Itasca Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Itasca Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. Job vacancies in Northeast reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).




Figure 10. Time Leaving Home to go to Work, 2022 ■ Itasca Co. ■ Minnesota 0% 20% 40% 12:00 a.m. to 6.6% 4:59 a.m. 5:00 a.m. to 5:59 a.m. 9.2% 6:00 a.m. to 6:59 20.5% 19.2% 7:00 a.m. to 7:59 27.7% a.m. 28.7% 8:00 a.m. to 8:59 13.6% a.m. 14.7% 9:00 a.m. to 19.6% 11:59 p.m. 23.5%

## **INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING**

Itasca Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Itasca Co. had the 71st highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Itasca Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$15.46 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$16.89 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).



## **OCCUPATIONS**

At \$22.57 in 2023, wages were lower in Region 3 than the state. Overall, Region 3 had the 6th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$42.6) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.05) (see Table 11).



Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2007-2022


