Kandiyohi Co. is the 23rd largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased over the past decade, ranking as the 32nd fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Kandiyohi Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).


Kandiyohi Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Kandiyohi Co. welcomed net international in-migration gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).



POPULATION PROJECTIONS



Job vacancies in Central reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).




LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS



sota Figure 12. Year Structure Built, 2022





Figure 13. Housing Costs as a Percentage of Income, 2022

OCCUPATIONS

At \$21.2 in 2023, wages were lower in Region 6E than the state. Overall, Region 6E had the 3rd lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$43.27) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.1) (see Table 11).



Kandiyohi Co. is a part of the Central planning region, which is projected to see a 5% increase in employment levels over the next decade. In addition to new jobs created, there will be a much larger number of exit openings (see Figure 15).


