Ramsey Co. is the 2nd largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased over the past decade, ranking as the 24th fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Ramsey Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a smaller percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Ramsey Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Ramsey Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).







Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Ramsey Co. averaged an annual loss of fewer workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Ramsey Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).




Job vacancies in Twin Cities reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).



LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Ramsey Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Ramsey Co. is more racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Ramsey Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Ramsey Co. had the 18th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.




The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Ramsey Co. had a higher cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$17.87 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$21.56 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).




ota Figure 12. Year Structure Built, 2022






