Wilkin Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 4, which is located in the Northwest Planning Region.


POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS



Wilkin Co. is the 77th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased over the past decade, ranking as the 70th fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Wilkin Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Wilkin Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Wilkin Co. suffered net international out-migration - losing Minnesotans to other places (see Table 2).



POPULATION PROJECTIONS


According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Wilkin Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Wilkin Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Wilkin Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.2%, Wilkin Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Wilkin Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 3.6% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Wilkin Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.


Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Wilkin Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Wilkin Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. Job vacancies in Northwest reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).






Figure 10. Time Leaving Home to go to Work, 2022 Wilkin Co. ■ Minnesota 0% 20% 40% 60% 12:00 a.m. to 1.8% 4:59 a.m. 5:00 a.m. to 5:59 a.m. 6:00 a.m. to 6:59 18.7% 19.2% 7:00 a.m. to 7:59 42.4% a.m. 28.7% 8:00 a.m. to 8:59 a.m. 14.7% 9:00 a.m. to 18.0% 11:59 p.m. 23.5%



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Wilkin Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Wilkin Co. had the 54th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Wilkin Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.15 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$14.51 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).



Wilkin Co. had a lower median house value than the state, having the 57th highest value of the 87 counties in 2021. Wilkin Co.'s housing stock was older than the state's, with a lower percentage of units built since 2000 (see Figure 12).



OCCUPATIONS

At \$21.88 in 2023, wages were lower in Region 4 than the state. Overall, Region 4 had the 9th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$40.79) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.11) (see Table 11).



Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2007-2022


