Yellow Medicine Co. is the 71st largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased over the past decade, ranking as the 85th fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Yellow Medicine Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Yellow Medicine Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net out-migration meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Yellow Medicine Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

POPULATION PROJECTIONS


According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Yellow Medicine Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to decrease over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

Job vacancies in Southwest reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).



LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Yellow Medicine Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Yellow Medicine Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Yellow Medicine Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Yellow Medicine Co. had the 39th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Yellow Medicine Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.97 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$15.21 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

ota Figure 12. Year Structure Built, 2022






Figure 13. Housing Costs as a Percentage of Income, 2022


At \$20.82 in 2023, wages were lower in Region 6W than the state. Overall, Region 6W had the 2nd lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. 

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Yellow Medicine Co. had the 70th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Yellow Medicine Co. was the 68th fastest growing in the past year and the 83rd fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2022, employment in Yellow Medicine Co. is still down from the pandemic recession.
