

# **COUNTY PROFILE**

# Anoka Co.

Anoka Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 11, which is located in the Twin Cities Planning Region.

## **POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS**





Figure 1. Population Pyramid, 2000-2023

Anoka Co. is the 4th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 16th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Anoka Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a smaller percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Anoka Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Anoka Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).





## **POPULATION PROJECTIONS**

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Anoka Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

#### **EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT**


Anoka Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Anoka Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.





#### LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.6%, Anoka Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Anoka Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 3.3% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Anoka Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Anoka Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Anoka Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Twin Cities returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).

## LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Anoka Co. had a higher labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Anoka Co. is more racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.





A smaller percentage of workers in Anoka Co. worked in the same county in which they live compared to the state. Anoka Co. also had a longer average commute time than the state.





### INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Anoka Co. had a higher median household income than the state, and a lower percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Anoka Co. had the 8th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Anoka Co. had a higher cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$17.9 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$23.22 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

Anoka Co. had a higher median house value than the state, having the 8th highest value of the 87 counties in 2022. Anoka Co.'s housing stock was newer than the state's, with a higher percentage of units built since 2000 (see Figure 12).





## **OCCUPATIONS**

At \$27.78 in 2024, wages were higher in Region 11 than the state. Overall, Region 11 had the highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$63.5) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$15.6) (see Table 11).

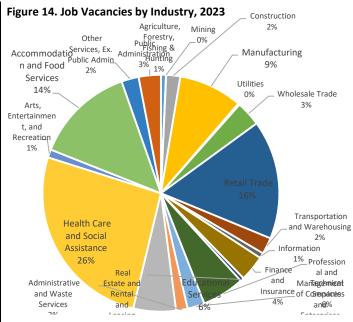

### **ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS**


Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Anoka Co. had the 4th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Anoka Co. was the 24th fastest growing in the past year and the 15th fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2023, employment in Anoka Co. grew despite the pandemic recession.

Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023


