


COUNTY PROFILE

Carlton Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 3, which is located in the Northeast Planning Region.


POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS



Carlton Co. is the 30th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 19th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Carlton Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Carlton Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Carlton Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).




Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population, 2022

POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Carlton Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

Carlton Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. 



LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 3.6%, Carlton Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Carlton Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 4.7% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Carlton Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Carlton Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Carlton Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Northeast returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).

LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Carlton Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Carlton Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



A smaller percentage of workers in Carlton Co. worked in the same county in which they live compared to the state. Carlton Co. also had a shorter average commute time than the state.



INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Carlton Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Carlton Co. had the 24th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.

The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Carlton Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$15.08 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$19.49 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).



OCCUPATIONS

At \$23.41 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 3 than the state. Overall, Region 3 had the 5th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$45.28) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.4) (see Table 11).







Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023


