

Lyon Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 8, which is located in the Southwest Planning Region.


POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS



Lyon Co. is the 41st largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 40th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Lyon Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Lyon Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Lyon Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).





According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Lyon Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).



LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.5%, Lyon Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Lyon Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 3.4% prepandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Lyon Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Lyon Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Lyon




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Southwest returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).



Lyon Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Lyon Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.


Figure 10. Time Leaving Home to go to Work, 2022 Lyon Co. ■ Minnesota 0% 20% 40% 60% 12:00 a.m. to 3.0% 4:59 a.m. 5:00 a.m. to 5:59 a.m. 6:00 a.m. to 6:59 17.9% 19.2% 7:00 a.m. to 7:59 40.2% a.m. 28.7% 8:00 a.m. to 8:59 13.9% a.m. 14.7% 9:00 a.m. to 19.2% 11:59 p.m. 23.5%

INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Lyon Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Lyon Co. had the 46th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Lyon Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.02 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$16.69 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).



OCCUPATIONS

At \$22.81 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 8 than the state. Overall, Region 8 had the 9th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$46.14) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.46) (see Table 11).

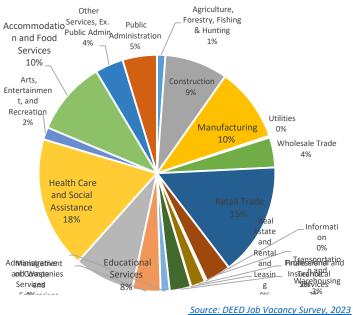

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS


Coming out of the pandemic recession, after losing jobs over the past year, Lyon Co. had the 31st largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Lyon Co. was the 70th fastest growing in the past year and the 58th fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2023, employment in Lyon Co. is still down from the pandemic recession.

Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023


