Red Lake Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 1, which is located in the Northwest Planning Region.


# **POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS**



Red Lake Co. is the 85th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased so far this decade, ranking as the 56th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Red Lake Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Red Lake Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Red Lake Co.did not see international in-migration (see Table 2).



Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population,



## **POPULATION PROJECTIONS**

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Red Lake Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to decrease over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

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#### **EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT**

**Total Population** 

Red Lake Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Red Lake Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.





#### LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 3.8%, Red Lake Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Red Lake Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 5.6% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Red Lake Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Red Lake Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Red




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Northwest returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).





# LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Red Lake Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Red Lake Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

A smaller percentage of workers in Red Lake Co. worked in the same county in which they live compared to the state. Red Lake Co. also had a longer average commute time than the state.





### INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Red Lake Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Red Lake Co. had the 25th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.




The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Red Lake Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.92 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$18.62 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

Red Lake Co. had a lower median house value than the state, having the 67th highest value of the 87 counties in 2022. Red Lake Co.'s housing stock was older than the state's, with a lower percentage of units built since 2000 (see Figure 12).



### **OCCUPATIONS**

At \$23.51 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 1 than the state. Overall, Region 1 had the 4th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$46.27) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.65) (see Table 11).



Figure 15. Regional Occupational **Employment Projections, 2020-2030** 



## **ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS**

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after losing jobs over the past year, Red Lake Co. had the 87th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Red Lake Co. was the 53rd fastest growing in the past year and the 72nd fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2023, employment in Red Lake Co. is still down from the pandemic recession.


