Todd Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 5, which is located in the Northwest Planning Region.

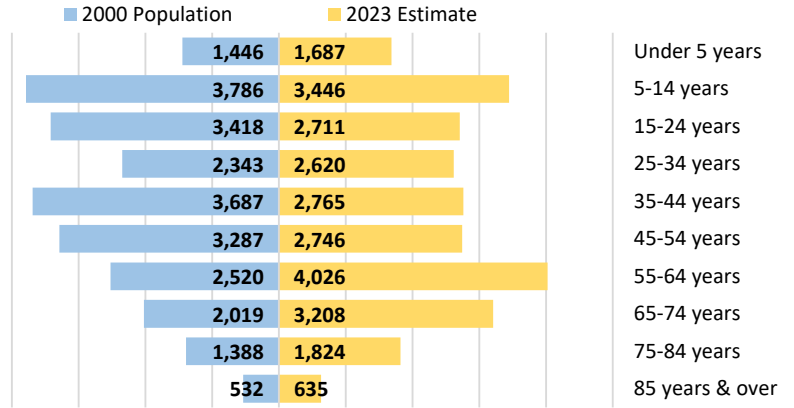

Todd Co. is the 42nd largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population increased so far this decade, ranking as the 22nd fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Todd Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Todd Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Todd Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

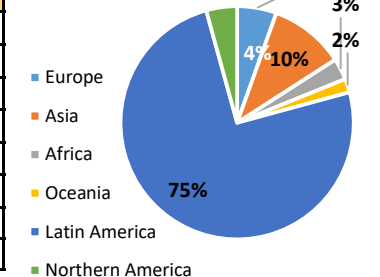

Figure 3. Population by Race, 2022

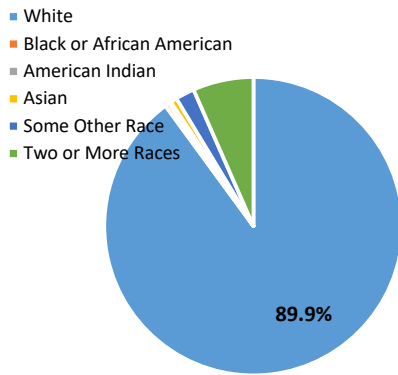

POPULATION PROJECTIONS

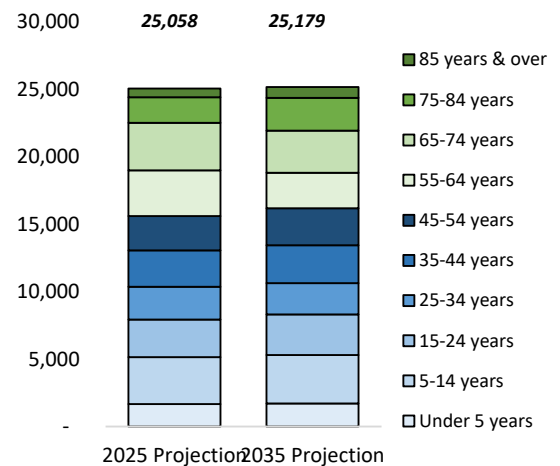
According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Todd Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

Figure 4. Projections by Age Group, 2025-2035

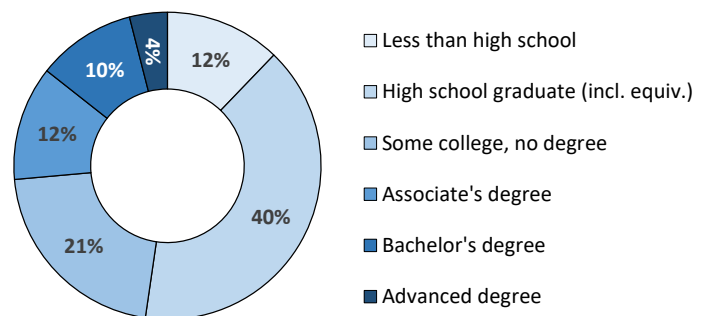


EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Todd Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Todd Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2022



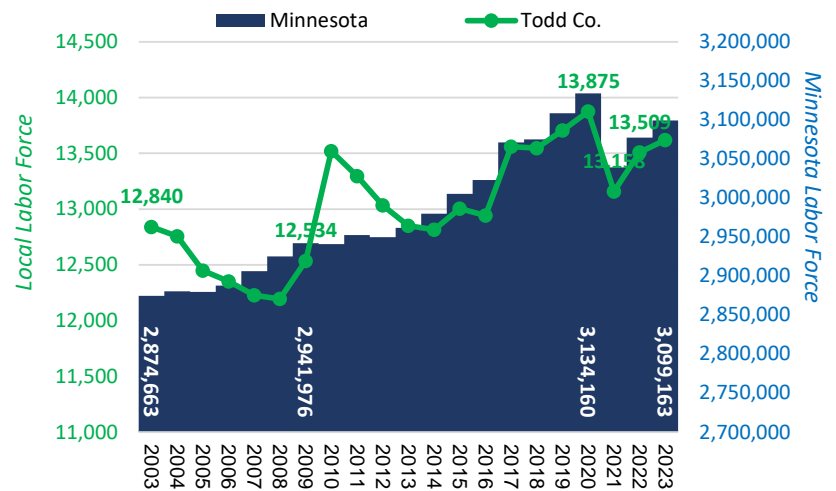

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 3.2%, Todd Co. had a higher unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Todd Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 4.7% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Todd Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

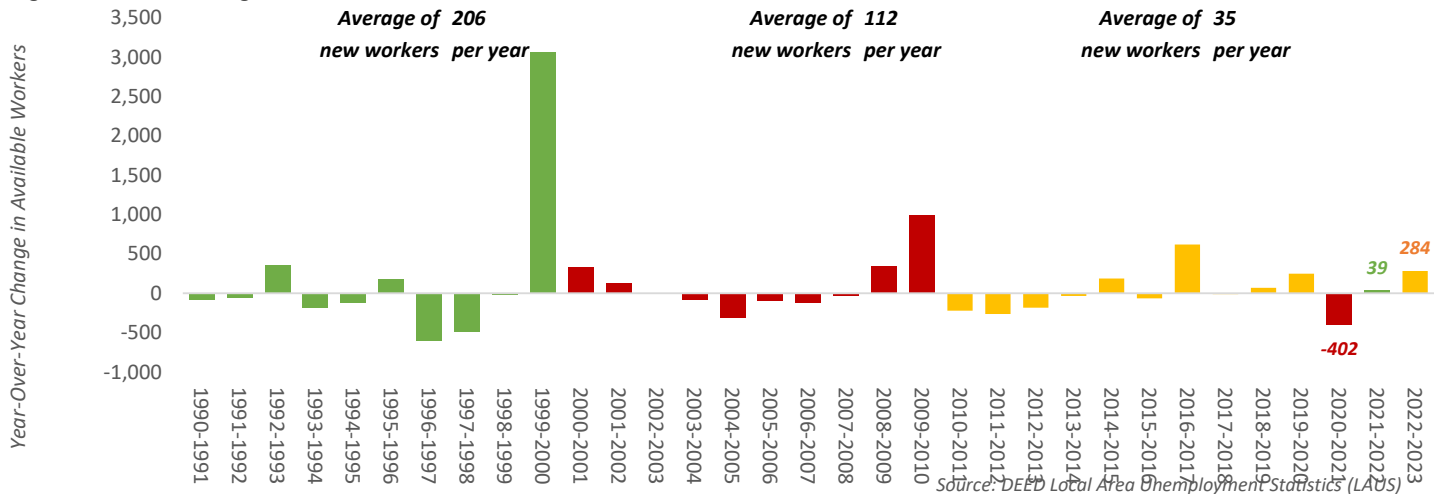
Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Todd Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Todd Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).

Figure 7. Annual Change in Labor Force, 1990-2023



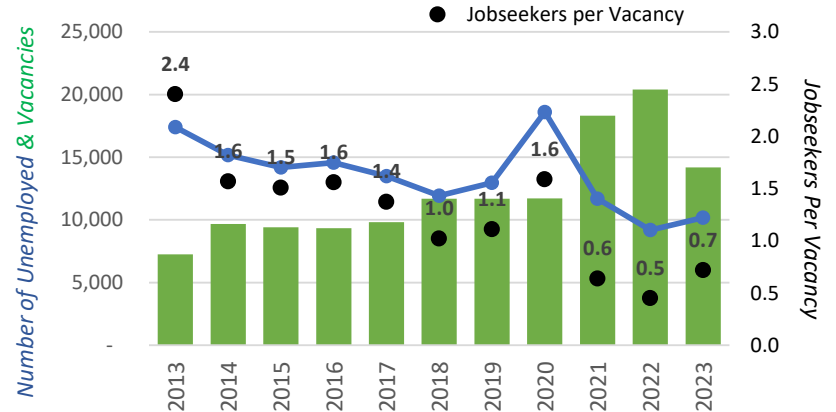

The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Northwest returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).

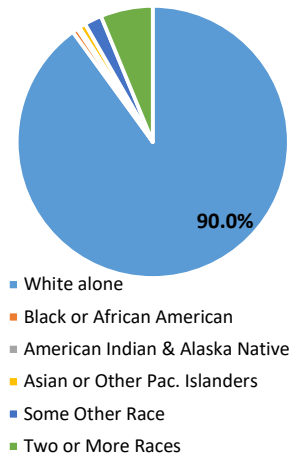
LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Todd Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Todd Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

Figure 9. Labor Force by Race, 2022



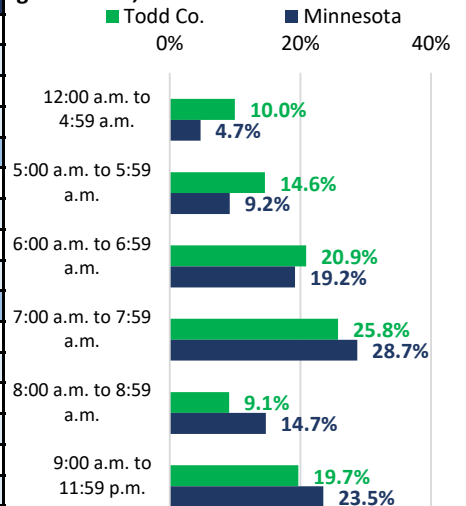

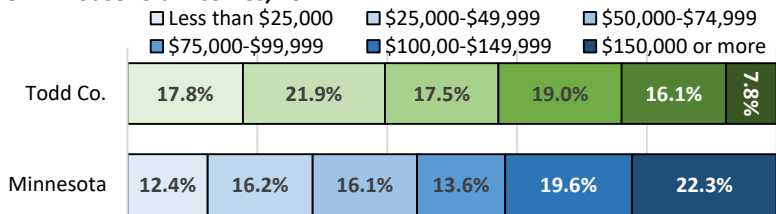
INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Todd Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$14.61 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$18.77 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

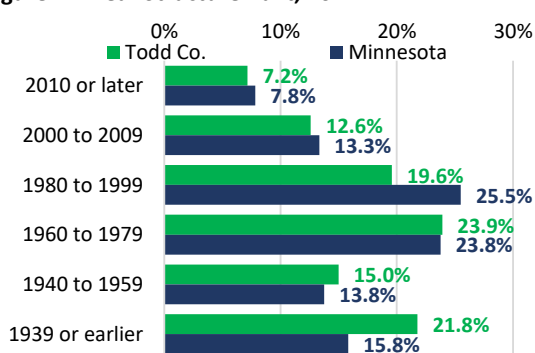

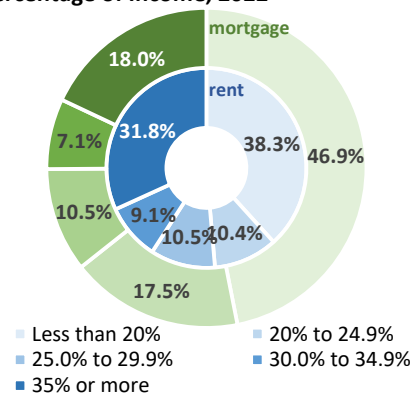

OCCUPATIONS

At \$21.89 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 5 than the state. Overall, Region 5 had the lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$40.32) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.34) (see Table 11).

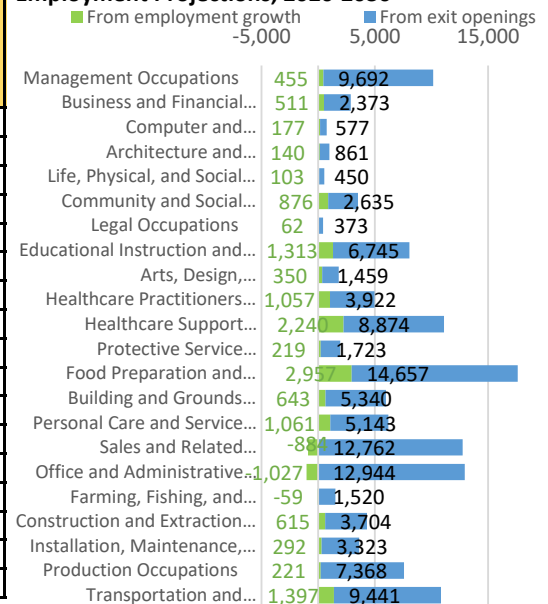

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Todd Co. had the 47th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Todd Co. was the 13th fastest growing in the past year and the 18th fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2023, employment in Todd Co. grew despite the pandemic recession.

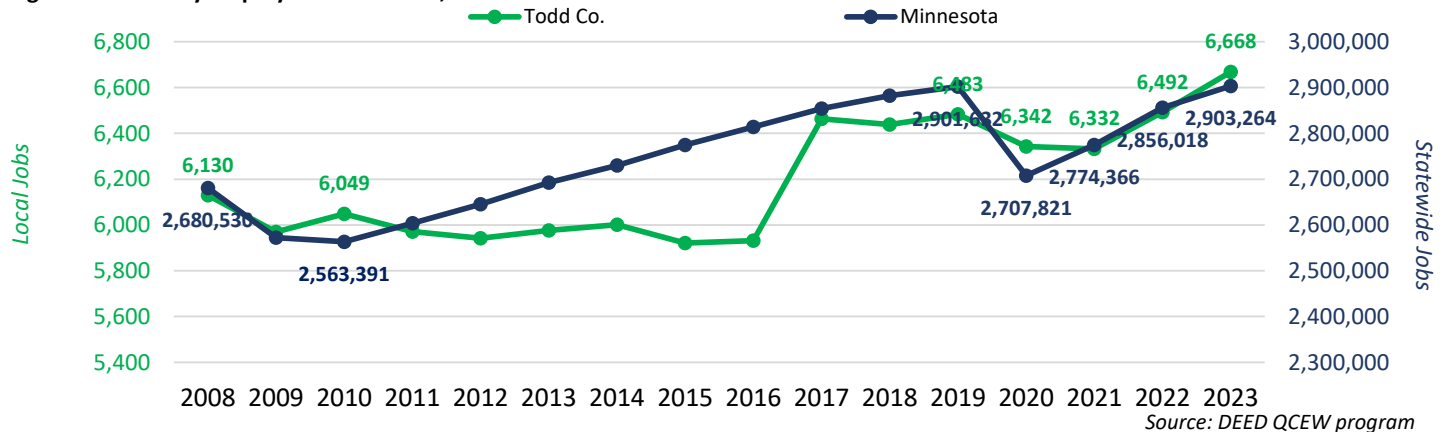

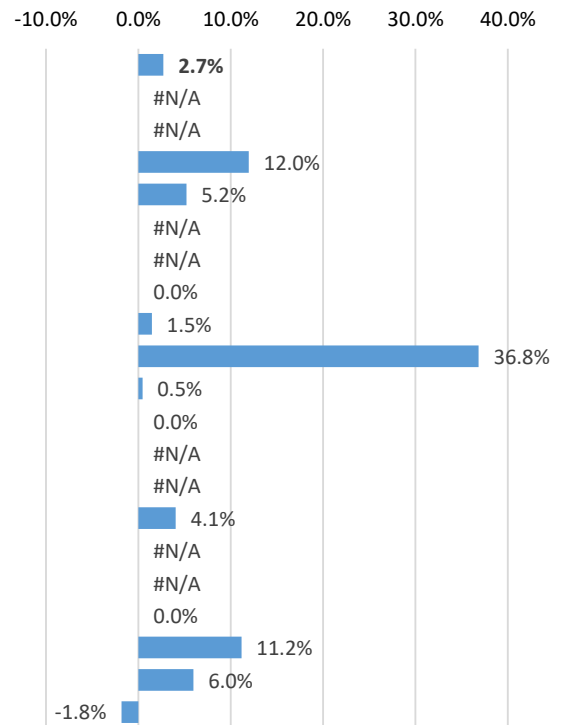
Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023
