

Lac Qui Parle Co. is the 76th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased so far this decade, ranking as the 65th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Lac Qui Parle Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Lac Qui Parle Co. suffered a negative natural increase - more deaths than births from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Lac Qui Parle Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).




Figure 2. Place of Birth for the Foreign Born Population, 2022

POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Lac Qui Parle Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to decrease over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Lac Qui Parle Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. 

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.8%, Lac Qui Parle Co. had a identical unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Lac Qui Parle Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 3.8% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Lac Qui Parle Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Lac Qui Parle Co. averaged an annual loss of fewer workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Southwest returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).

LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Lac Qui Parle Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Lac Qui Parle Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.







INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Lac Qui Parle Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Lac Qui Parle Co. had the 57th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Lac Qui Parle Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$13.33 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$17.38 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).




Figure 13. Housing Costs as a

OCCUPATIONS

At \$22.61 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 6W than the state. Overall, Region 6W had the 2nd lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$42.4) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.38) (see Table 11).



ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after gaining jobs over the past year, Lac Qui Parle Co. had the 77th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Lac Qui Parle Co. was the 54th fastest growing in the past year and the 41st fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2023, employment in Lac Qui Parle Co. is still down from the pandemic recession.

Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023


