

COUNTY PROFILE

Nicollet Co.

Nicollet Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 9, which is located in the Southwest Planning Region.

POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS





Figure 1. Population Pyramid, 2000-2023

Nicollet Co. is the 32nd largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased so far this decade, ranking as the 57th fastest growing in the state from 2020 to 2023. Nicollet Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Nicollet Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2023, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Nicollet Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).







According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Nicollet Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2025 to 2035, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (4.5%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT


Nicollet Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (93.0%), and a higher percentage of people with at least some college experience. Nicollet Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

At 2.2%, Nicollet Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state in 2023. After the pandemic recession Nicollet Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to the 2.6% pre-pandemic rate posted in 2019. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Nicollet Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2019.





Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Nicollet Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Nicollet Co. is expected to add workers from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).




The labor market had grown extremely tight in recent years, with less than 1 jobseeker per vacancy until the pandemic recession intervened in early 2020 and the number of unemployed workers spiked. In 2023, job vacancies in Southwest returned to pre-pandemic levels, but employers are still seeing challenges finding enough workers for open jobs (see Figure 8).





INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Nicollet Co. had a lower median household income than the state, and a higher percentage of households with incomes below \$50,000. Overall, Nicollet Co. had the 15th highest median household income of the 87 counties in the state.



The cost of living has increased over the past 2 years with costs up in many areas. Nicollet Co. had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$14.8 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$18.4 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

Nicollet Co. had a lower median house value than the state, having the 25th highest value of the 87 counties in 2022. Nicollet Co.'s housing stock was newer than the state's, with a higher percentage of units built since 2000 (see Figure 12).

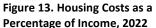



OCCUPATIONS

At \$23.24 in 2024, wages were lower in Region 9 than the state. Overall, Region 9 had the 6th highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$47.87) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$14.69) (see Table 11).



ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS


Coming out of the pandemic recession, after losing jobs over the past year, Nicollet Co. had the 29th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Nicollet Co. was the 82nd fastest growing in the past year and the 56th fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2023, employment in Nicollet Co. is still down from the pandemic recession.

Figure 16. Industry Employment Statistics, 2008-2023


