2023 END-OF-YEAR REPORT

Small businesses make a big impact on Minnesota's economy.

To better serve startups, small businesses and entrepreneurs, the office includes: Launch Minnesota, the Small Business Assistance and Community Partnerships.



IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS:



Increasing access to capital

- Awarded \$33.8 million through 380 grants to Main Street businesses leveraging \$304 million in matching financing.
- Launch MN **tech startups** raised an additional \$19.80 for every \$1 granted through innovation grants. This year \$1.2 million was awarded to 43 startups.
- SBDC helped 288 unique small businesses access \$131 million in capital.
- Distributed \$1.9 million in child care economic development grants that will provide 2,066 new childcare slots.
- \$86.48 million in grants will be deployed through partners to support diverse and disadvantaged small businesses seeking opportunities following the pandemic and civil unrest through Promise Act grants in early 2024.



Improving connectivity between businesses and resources:

- Connected 85+ organizations in the Launch Minnesota Network to help start and scale businesses.
- Implemented monthly Minnesota Small Business Calls averaging over 95 participants.
- Leveling the playing field for women, veterans, BIPOC founders and those living in greater MN:
 - > Technical assistance support (see graph)
 - > 60% of Launch Minnesota innovation grants awarded to targeted founders.
- Partnered with the Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State to provide better access to DEED and statewide resources.
- Hosted with partners MN Venture events, connecting 31 startups to 283 investors inside and outside of Minnesota.
- Created a new Child Care Office to increase the quantity of child care available and improve accessibility for underserved communities.



Expanding capacity for businesses to start and scale:

- SBDC provided 30,158 hours of consulting to 4,418 businesses.
- Provided \$12M to 41 organizations to assist businesses and entrepreneurs focused on equity, innovation and vibrancy.
- Managing over \$30 million in direct appropriations from legislators to organizations to provide technical assistance.
- Responded to an increase of 17% phone calls and 263% increase in emails from small businesses.
- 700 businesses received lean start up education through our partners.
