Mission: Help Minnesotans find jobs

Goal: Replace MinnesotaWorks.net

- Create one easy-to-use website that can help Minnesota job seekers find jobs
- Help Minnesotans find the resources that can help them overcome barriers to employment
- Fulfill regulatory requirements for providing a labor exchange



Labor exchange basics

- Every state is required by federal law to provide a labor exchange
- MinnesotaWorks.net is MN's current labor exchange. It serves many purposes:
 - A job search website
 - A scheduling website for events and appointments
 - Service and activity tracking
 - Primary data source for federally mandated Wagner-Peyser reporting

Replacing MinnesotaWorks.net

- 2019-2022, DEED kicked off a project to replace MinnesotaWorks.net with a vendor hosted and managed solution
- March 2023, DEED chose not to renew or amend the contract with that vendor
- We changed our approach and strategy using lessons learned such as having the requirements guide the strategy, having clear lines of accountability, and avoiding an all or nothing strategy



DEED long-term goals

- Provide an excellent user experience
- Provide an integrated customer experience
 - Fewer accounts and websites for job seekers to navigate
- Transform the digital workforce development system to meet the needs of job-seekers and employers

1. User Interface



- Updating URL to align with Minnesota state government naming and security standards



- DEED staff will still vet and validate employers
- DEED's affiliation with the National Association of Workforce Agencies makes this a free option
 - We anticipate this will lead to savings on development costs


Where the jobs on MinnesotaWorks.net come from:

- Starting now Noticeable improvements to CareerForceMN.com on a regular basis
- February 2025 Cutover from MinnesotaWorks.net to new site
- Future Continue to make improvements on new site





Project funding

- These projects are being funded by a combination of:
 - Legislative funding secured during the 2023 session
 - Internal DEED and MJSP funding
- No funding is needed from LWDA system partners for these projects
- Our new system design is meant to help keep future costs sustainable

- The team is committed to giving Minnesota job seekers an incredible customer experience.
