


STATE of MINNESOTA

WHEREAS:	Investment in the education, training, and career advancement of Minnesota's workforce is crucial to the ability of our state to compete in the global economy and to achieve economic equity; and
WHEREAS:	Bringing all Minnesotans who need to work into our labor force in a meaningful way is critical to the strength of Minnesota's employers and workers; and
WHEREAS:	By 2035, one in four Minnesotans will be from a Community of Color or Indigenous population; and
WHEREAS:	Unprecedented changes in our state demographics between 2015 and 2035, including more than a half-million people reaching the age of 65 and a decline in the share of the working-age population from 62% to 57%, means employers and Minnesota's workforce development system must work together to create an inclusive workforce where all are welcome; and
WHEREAS:	Bringing all Minnesotans who need a sustainable wage into the workforce will help address employment and economic disparities based on race, disability, age, veteran status, national origin, or justice involvement; and
WHEREAS:	Minnesota employers in manufacturing, health care, and other industries that are crucial drivers of the state's economy need more workers with in-demand skills to meet the needs of their businesses and communities; and
WHEREAS:	The historic state investments in workforce development coming out of the 2023 legislative session provide Minnesota's workforce development professionals with new tools to meet our state's workforce needs; and
WHEREAS:	Collaboration among all members of Minnesota's workforce development system, including industry partners, workforce development entities, education, labor, and community-based organizations, is critical to system alignment and preparing a workforce to meet the labor needs; and
WHEREAS:	The Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development and its workforce development partners in CareerForce help jobseekers identify their interests and skills and assist them in developing a strong job search strategy leading to fulfilling employment; and
WHEREAS:	CareerForce helps Minnesota employers find employment candidates with the right skills and interest for their open positions so they can hire and retain the employees they need to grow and thrive.
