Wabasha Co. is the 45th largest of the 87 counties in the state. Its population decreased over the past decade, ranking as the 47th fastest growing in the state from 2010 to 2022. Wabasha Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Wabasha Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2020 to 2022, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Wabasha Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).





Figure 2. Place of Birth for



POPULATION PROJECTIONS





LABOR FORCE TRENDS




Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers each year from 1990 to 2000, Wabasha Co. averaged an annual loss of fewer workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Wabasha Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2025 to 2035 (see Table 6).

Job vacancies in Southeast reached new highs in the 4th quarter of 2021, quickly bringing back challenges in finding new workers and 2022 showed the lowest jobseeker-per-vacancy ratio on record (see Figure 8).



LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Wabasha Co. had a lower labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Wabasha Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 81.3% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.



Figure 12. Year Structure Built, 2022






Figure 13. Housing Costs as a Percentage of Income, 2022

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




ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

Coming out of the pandemic recession, after losing jobs over the past year, Wabasha Co. had the 48th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Wabasha Co. was the 82nd fastest growing in the past year and the 69th fastest growing since 2019. From 2019 to 2022, employment in Wabasha Co. is still down from the pandemic recession.
