OMC-BEP Dress Code Guidelines:

1. Guidelines apply to operators as well as their employees.
2. All operators and their employees must be properly identified. If there are employees, the operator's name tag must include the designation "manager" or "owner" etc. Proper identification includes "sewn-on" and/or removable name tags.
3. If the operator believes that their dress is appropriate, but the coordinator does not, the operator may appeal to the Operator Management Committee.
4. Writing or pictures on clothes are acceptable only if they have something to do with that business.
5. Whatever you wear must be clean, in good condition, and fit.
6. Dress appropriately for the customers you serve.

Always appropriate; smocks, dress shirt or blouse with or without tie, dress slacks, skirts or dresses. Uniforms are always acceptable in vending machine locations; most would be acceptable in all other locations.

Never appropriate; undershirts worn on the outside, cut-offs, sweatpants, wind suits, bare feet, worn out shoes with holes or sandals.

A closed toe shoe is required when working with food & beverage products such as when servicing vending machines. A safety toe shoe is not required but is encouraged.
